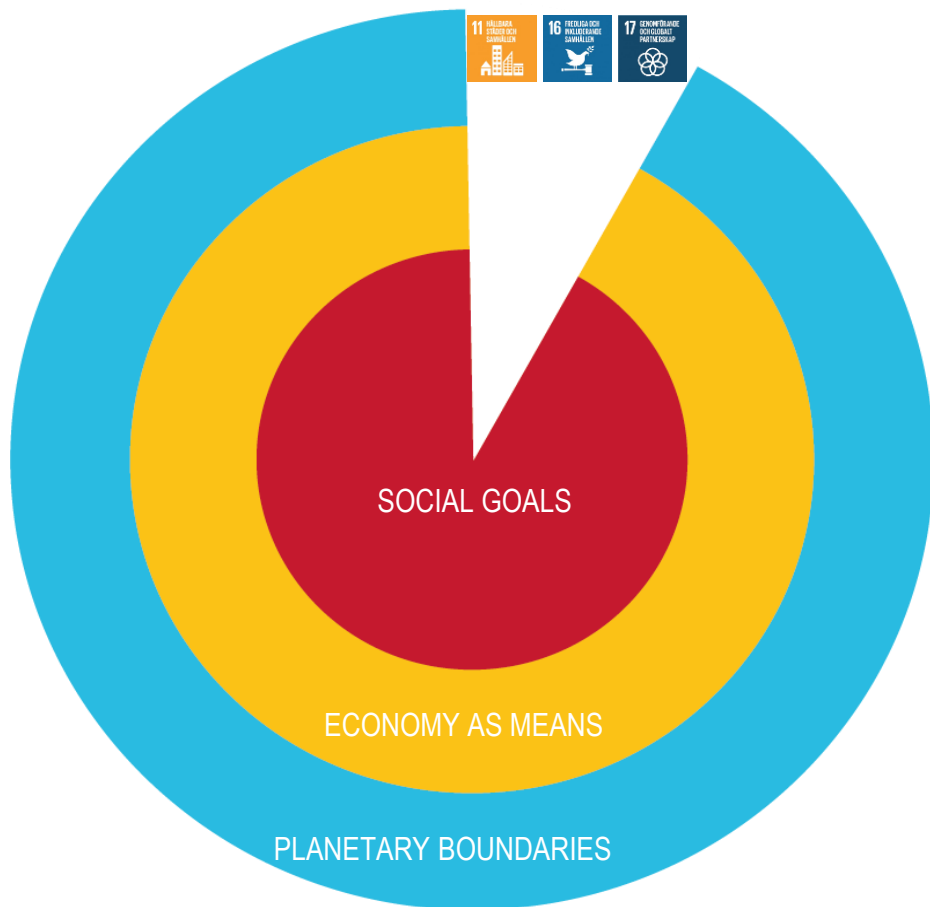

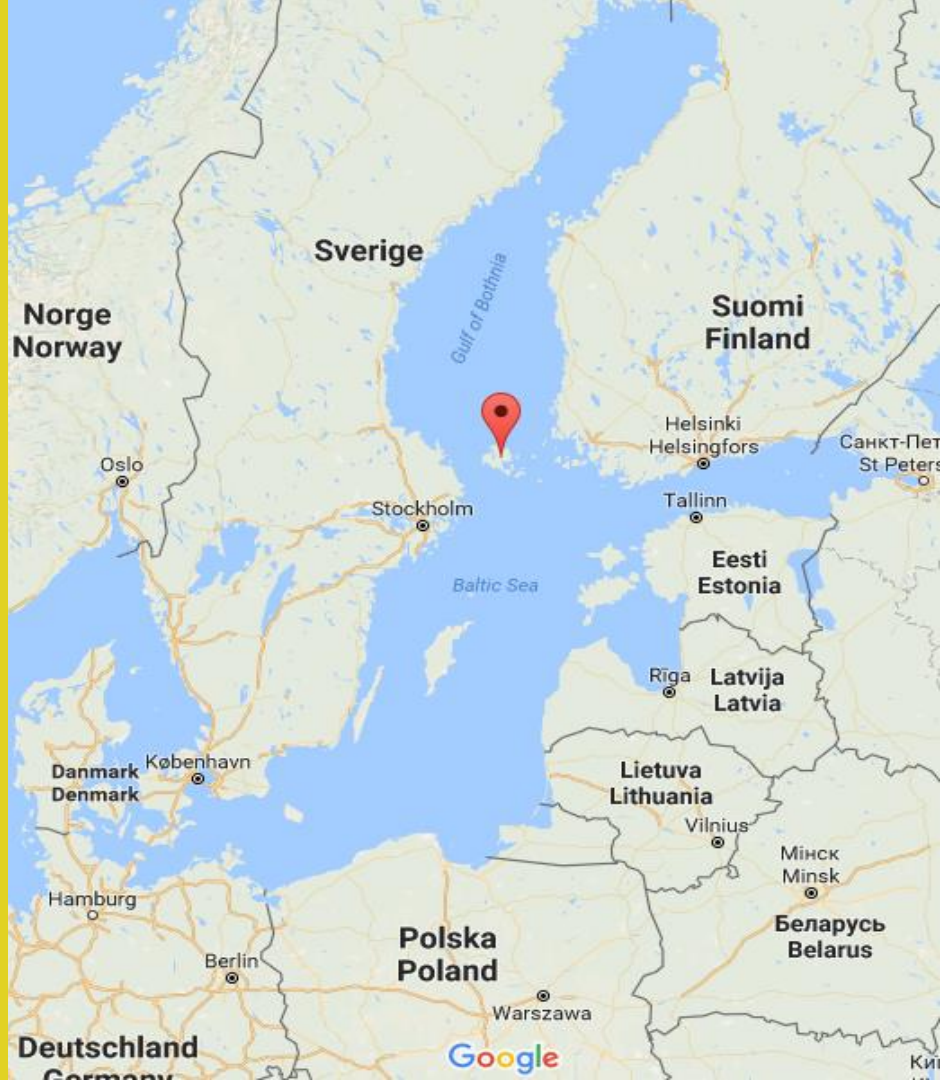

# DEVELOPMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY AGENDA FOR ÅLAND

- **Milestone 2014, the Åland parliament and the Åland government chose to adopt a common pursuit of total sustainable development in Åland no later than 2051.**
- September 2015, UN member states formally adopt the *Agenda 2030*
- Beginning of 2016, *the network bärkraft.ax*, including the *Development and Sustainability Council* is established at the initiative of operators from the public sector, the business community, associations and the educational sector.
- September 2016, the launch of *The Development and Sustainability Agenda for Åland*, open for everyone / supported by an expert panel/developed by hundreds of people.
- September 2017, the first Progress report is presented during the second *Social Forum*

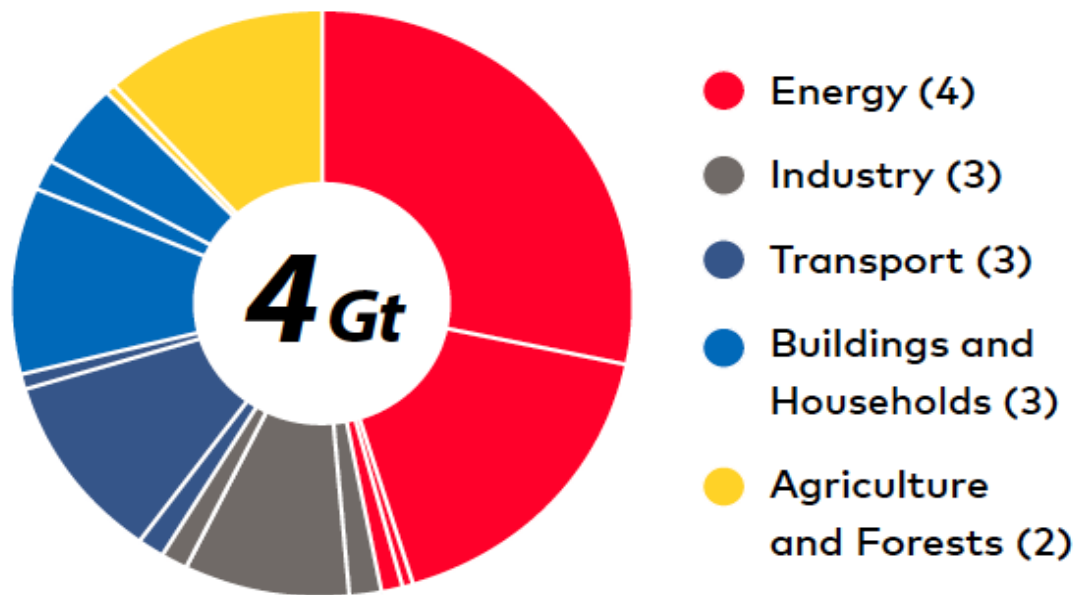
